Owner Brigid Watson set up Ards Peninsula Tours to build on her background in environmental and sustainability education and offer guests intimate insights into the natural heritage of her locale. A former teacher and charted environmentalist, she likes nothing better than introducing her clients to the local wildlife and nature and to the area's rich Christian and pre-Christian heritage.

Many of Ards Peninsula Tours' clients have come to Northern Ireland to research their roots and family links and love their immersion in the history and heritage of the Ards Peninsula and surrounding countryside. Brigid's genealogical research for clients results in strong friendships and a deeper rootedness and quality of experience — a rich anchoring and understanding of the social, historical and environmental context of St Patrick's Country, Strangford Lough and the Ards area

Brigid's environmental credentials come from formal education, continuous research into the countryside and, recently, local coastal erosion and from living on her family farm, overlooking the Irish sea. For over ten years traditional Irish varieties of potato were grown and sold at a roadside stall with an honesty box; today potatoes are still sold and also locally produced free range eggs. A native Irish apple orchard has been planted and sheep reared on the farm - making spring lambing a busy time. Guests are invited to visit the farm, learn about agri-environmental schemes they've participated in and the biodiversity of the natural environment, as well as changes in farming locally over the last century.

A choice of coach, walking and boat tours is offered. The Christian heritage Nendrum Monastic site on Island Mahee on Strangford Lough can be reached by a causeway. The choice of tour extends to those that demonstrate the connect between conservation and the land in Areas of Outstanding Natural Beauty and to pre-Christian, Celtic and Christian heritage.
